BLAZED A HEROIC TRAIL FOR WOMEN'S BOXING

In 1998, 5-times World Champion boxer Jane Couch MBE took the British Boxing Board of Control to court after they refused her a boxing licence. Her story is now to be a major movie.

The reason? Because in their words, PMT made women "too unstable" to box safely. Despite the fact that 8 YEARS EARLIER in 1990, over 40,000 US female troops were deployed in combat positions during the Gulf War.

Jane's journey is one to behold. From the backstreets of Fleetwood; a tough northern fishing town onto illegal unlicenced bouts across America (and an infamous appearance on Barrymore) - Jane has captivated the media for 30 years, both in the UK and world-wide and will continue to do so.

Now Jane's fascinating story is the subject of a major motion picture based upon her life as told in best selling biography 'The Final Round'. The movie is backed by a team of investors led by award-winning actress Suranne Jones as Executive Producer. (Vigil, Gentleman Jack, Doctor Foster)

The production team behind Downton Abbey are poised over a £35 Million budget. Up-and-coming BAFTA Nominee Niamh Algar (Malpractice, Deceit, Calm with horses) is tipped for the role of Jane.

CAREER ACHIEVEMENTS

Jane Couch, MBE (born 14 August 1968) is a British professional boxer who competed from 1994 to 2007. She became the first licensed female boxer in the United Kingdom in 1998, and won no less than 5 world titles. Jane has since become a boxing promoter.

In 2007 she was awarded the MBE honour in recognition of her work with mental health charities and service to sport. In 2023 Jane, along with pal Ricky Hatton were inducted into the International Boxing Hall of Fame, alongside the likes of Muhammad Ali, Joe Frazier and Rocky Marciano.

In 2024 she also took part in the ring walk for Natasha Jonas on Sky pay per view boxing.

Her own personal struggles have galvanised the nation and her popularity is set to grow even more with the release of the blockbuster movie about her life.


